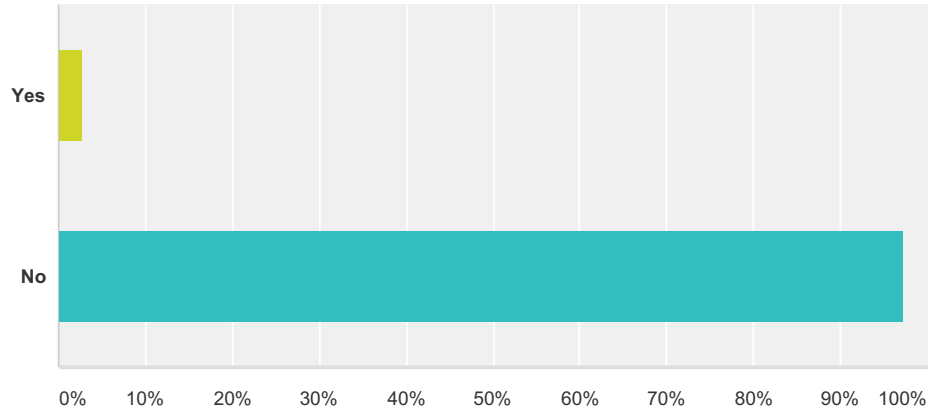


Q1 Is someone who has been hazed a better member of an organization than someone who has not been hazed?

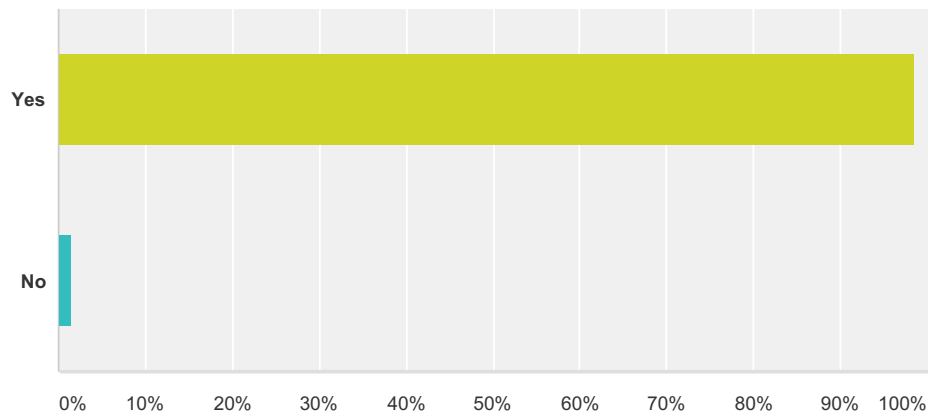

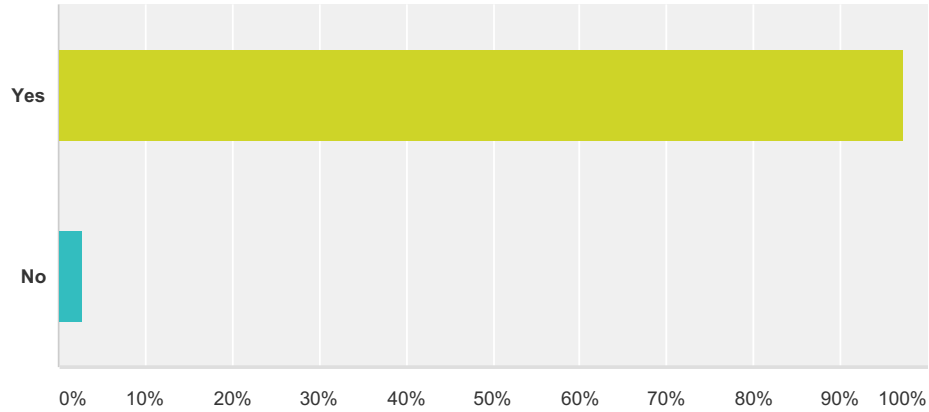

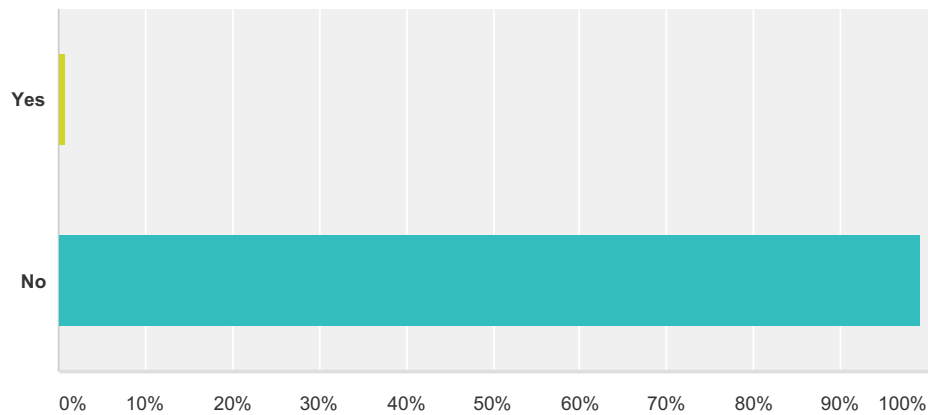

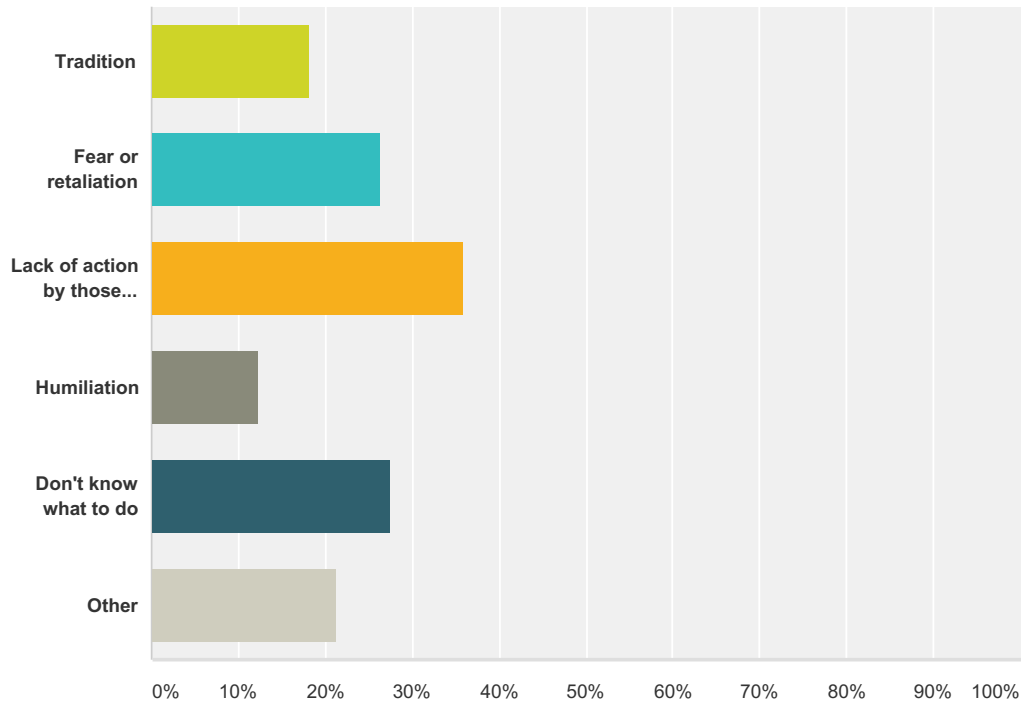
